Dr. Crown's FAQ of the Month

Dear Dr. Crown: When the date a patient had his/her Access Type placed is **before** our current Admit Date in CROWNWeb, what date should we enter in the required field for "Date Access Type Changed?" – *Clinical Data Manager*

Dear Clinical Data Manager: If the patient's Access Type "changed" prior to his/her admission to your facility, you should use the patient's current Admit Date as a default, because currently, a facility cannot enter dates prior to a patient's admission date. By entering the Admit Date, you are indicating the Access Type that was in use when the patient was admitted to your facility. Be aware this direction may change in future releases.
